(Priority intervention Neighbourhoods / Areas)








BIP/ZIP Areas in Marvila District.














Public Transport in Lisbon CHL area and surroundings:

- Connection level between train and subway









REGIONAL INTEGRATION (1/2)

PMA is in a complex and marginalized area of Lisbon, now under big real estate pressure.

The area was originally occupied by aristocrats' houses, and later (19th century) by industrial compounds – the reason why many workers settled there.


The area was gradually abandoned since the 20th century, being left with many unused warehouses and factories.

Today, it's characterized by degraded buildings - right next to several social housing neighbourhoods - and an aging, vulnerable, and low-income population.



WHAT HAPPENED

Local Action Group preparation

Contact with associations and groups working (or intending to) on the territory, including partners from previous BIP/ZIP Projects who developed a local diagnose through participatory processes.

Rock H2020 Project synergies

Preparation of common events for the community and the territory.

Functional Program

Defined by Lisbon Mayor - with Housing, Culture and Social Rights portfolios – changing the priority use of the site to affordable rental housing.

Contract invitations were made:

- 1) rehabilitation of some areas of the building
- 2) anthropological study of Marvila Velha.

Decision process

Start the use of the building for community local initiatives;

Prioritize affordable rental housing, keeping the cultural / community use;

Phasing of the intervention.
